

If you are seeking to transfer from HELP University after completing the **1st year of the Bachelor of Economics (Hons)** program, to the **Bachelor of Economics** at the UNSW Australia Business School, you are eligible for advanced standing. Credit of up to **48 Units of Credit (UOC) / 8 courses (equivalent to 1 year)** may be awarded. To receive the credit you will need to achieve a minimum **CGPA of 2.8** out of 4. This CGPA will be assessed on a regular basis and may be subject to change.

For **other undergraduate degree programs** offered at UNSW Business School, eligibility for entry and advanced standing will be assessed upon application.
