

Students who complete the **Foundation in Arts** program at **HELP University** may apply for entry to selected undergraduate degree programs at the UNSW Australia Business School. Applicants are required to have:

- Successfully completed the Foundation in Arts program and met the relevant degree entry requirements set in section A; and
- Undertaken a program of study that meets requirements outlined in section B.

Eligible students will be admitted to the first year of the degree program. No advanced standing / course credits are awarded upon entry.

Section B: Curriculum (as of May 2015) and program of study for UNSW Business School entry

For entry into the UNSW Business School degree programs listed in section A, HELP University Foundation in Arts graduates need to have completed a program of study comprising the 9 compulsory subjects, 3 electives specified as required for UNSW entry, and 1 additional elective from a choice of three specified as required for UNSW entry.
