If you have successfully completed the **first 2 years of the Sarjana Ekonomi (Bachelor of Economics) International Undergraduate Program** at Universitas Indonesia (UI), you may apply to enter the **Bachelor of Commerce** at UNSW Business School, and be granted advanced standing. Credit of up to **48 Units of Credit (UOC) / 8 courses (equivalent to 1 year)** may be awarded on the basis that:

- You achieve a minimum **CGPA of 3** out of 4 in the first 2 years at UI; AND
- You satisfy English language proficiency requirements for admission to UNSW, as detailed at [www.unsw.edu.au/elp](http://www.unsw.edu.au/elp).
